- Diagnosed with Type 1 Diabetes in 1997
 - 8 years old
 - Dx early
 - Symptoms: extreme thirst, lethargic, no energy, bed wetting
- Type 1 sibling
 - Dx one year prior
 - Originally misdiagnosed (stomach virus)
 - DKA
 - Minutes away from death

...at least we had each other!

- The birth of Social Media





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There is NO cure for Type 1 Diabetes

Without insulin, a person living with Type 1 Diabetes cannot survive

This is a life or death issue


Dr. Banting discovered insulin in 1920's, sold patent for \$1

Insulin Costs around \$2-6 to produce

2020: Insulin can cost up to \$400 retail (mine costs \$333 per vial)

Rx Savings Cards, not the answer





"If you have private or commercial insurance, such as insurance you receive through an employer or purchase yourself, you may be eligible to get savings..."



"...but what about insulin savings cards?"

"...what about patient assistance programs?"

"...haven't you heard about Walmart insulin, it's \$25, my diabetic dog uses it!?!?!"

"...try diet and exercise, it cured my diabetes!!!"

- READ THE FINE PRINT


...this is not a solution to the insulin crisis in the USA
